You have been given this leaflet by your GP or physiotherapist following an assessment which shows that you MAY need a hip replacement operation. PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING CAREFULLY. IT TELLS YOU ABOUT A VERY IMPORTANT CHANGE IN NHS CARE.

Owing to the changes in the way that elective surgery is organised nationally, you have now got a number of choices of where you can have your operation - all of them are free to you under NHS care.

One of the locations you can choose is the Nuffield Hospital, Ipswich which is working in partnership with the surgeons and anaesthetists of a company called Eastern Surgery Ltd.

Eastern Surgery enjoys a unique working relationship with Nuffield Hospitals in East Anglia - and provides a high quality service to NHS patients. This leaflet gives you information

about Eastern Surgery and will help you to decide where to have your operation.

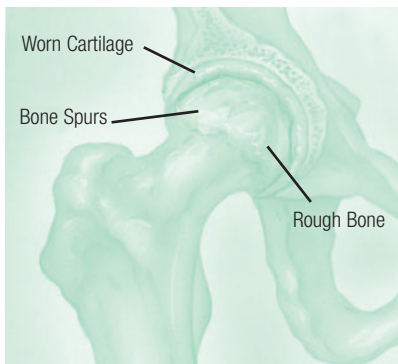

what happens next?

- 1.** Your GP will send your details to the local Referral or Booking Management Centre at the Primary Care Trust.
- 2.** You should contact the Referral or Booking Management Centre to discuss where you would like your operation to be undertaken.
- 3.** The Referral or Booking Management Centre will ask you to decide where you would like to have your hip replacement surgery. They will be able to answer non-clinical questions about the centres available to you.
- 4.** You may be asked by the Referral or Booking Management Centre to attend your local hospital for an x-ray before you see the consultant specialist.
- 5.** If you choose to have your operation with Eastern Surgery at the Nuffield Hospital, your details will be forwarded to the team at Eastern Surgery.
- 6.** The team at Eastern Surgery will contact you either by telephone or by letter a few days following your conversation with the Referral or Booking Management Centre. They will arrange a date for an appointment to see a consultant orthopaedic surgeon prior to the operation. Following your attendance at this appointment you will be given a date for the procedure and a date for a pre-assessment appointment where a nurse will assess your fitness for surgery.
- 7.** If you have any questions at this time please do not hesitate to ask one of the team at Eastern Surgery who will be happy to help.
- 8.** You will receive confirmation of all appointments in writing, together with an information leaflet explaining what will happen at the appointment and during the operation. It is important that you read this information or ask a carer or friend to help you do so. It will contain information relating to questions that you will be asked by the consultant at your first appointment.

Why have a hip replacement?

Osteoarthritis is the most common reason for a hip replacement. Osteoarthritis is a degenerative disorder often referred to as wear and tear arthritis.

However, there are many other types of arthritis such as rheumatoid arthritis which is caused by inflammation in the joint.

Hip Replacement



When your arthritis becomes so severe that the pain wakes you up at night or your joint movement becomes limited, preventing you from walking any distance an orthopaedic consultant may recommend surgery.

What is a hip replacement?

A total hip replacement is a surgical procedure in which damaged parts of the hip joint are replaced with an artificial joint (prosthesis). During the procedure the ball and socket joint that

joins the pelvis and thigh bone (femur) are removed.

How successful is a total hip replacement?

Results are normally very good. Almost all patients are relieved of their hip and groin pain. As the pain lessens, function also improves. Most patients have an improved range of movement and limp less.

How long do artificial hips last?

Hip replacements do eventually wear out. The major long term problem is loosening. This occurs because the cement crumbles (as old mortar in a brick wall) or because the bone melts away (reabsorbs) from around the replacement. Approximately 90% of total hip replacement joints will last 10 years or more.

When a hip replacement does wear out it can be revised. The results of a second operation (revised hip) are not as

good as the first time round.

Loosening in part is related to your weight and activity. It is important to take regular exercise after your operation and walking is encouraged. It is also important to control your weight and avoid impact exercise such as jogging and carrying heavy loads.

At your appointment with the consultant orthopaedic surgeon, you will be assessed to find out the best form of treatment for your hip problem. The consultant will then give you further information about what hip replacement surgery will involve.

If you and the consultant agree to go ahead with a hip replacement operation, you will be given an operation date and also a date for your pre-assessment appointment. During your pre-assessment a nurse will check your general health and fitness for the operation. This includes performing blood tests and other diagnostic tests.
